Aiken Williams Jr., 86, entered life on February 23, 1932 in in Yemassee, South Carolina to the late Aiken Williams Sr. and the late Louise Williams.

On Thursday, September 13, 2018 in the late afternoon God summoned Aiken into eternal slumber at his daughter's residence in Yemassee. His loving family was there with him when he slipped peacefully into eternal rest.

Aiken didn't have a diploma or degree in construction or automotive but he mastered the skills of carpentry and automotive better than most with the aforementioned diplomas or degrees. He was self-taught and had the ability to "catch on" to things with ease.

After leaving Yemassee and traversing the east coast northward in search of employment, Aiken was joined in holy matrimony to Thelma (Mitchell) Williams December 12, 1953. He and his young wife Thelma moved to Savannah, GA where he was employed with Bill Kehoe Tire Company for many years.

In 1968 Aiken and Thelma decided to move their young family to Paige Point, South Carolina in hope of giving their children a more wholesome and better quality of life.

After moving to South Carolina, Aiken found gainful employment with a construction company on Hilton Head Island where he helped build some of the most beautiful residential homes on the island.

In the late 70's or early 80's, Aiken's entrepreneurial ambition could not be halted so he decided to open a business doing the one thing that he loved the most...and that thing was "working on cars."

Aiken became the auto mechanic of Yemassee and the surrounding area. There was not a car or truck that Aiken could not repair. Aiken was known to give help to anyone in need of car services. There were several occasions where he would tow stranded travelers and their car from Interstate 95 to his place of business to be repaired and then take the travelers home for a good meal and a nights rest. He was truly one of a kind.

Aiken and Thelma's union existed for more than 64 years! This blessed union produced six wonderful children who are left to cherish the memories of their father: Three sons – Aiken (Shirley) Williams III of Stone Mountain, GA, Stanley Williams of Oxford, GA, and Keith (Danette, deceased) of Lilburn, GA. Three daughters- Nadine (Woody) Black of Clarksville, TN, Carol (John) Mixon of Yemassee, SC, Nicole (Darius) Anderson of Greenville, SC (Nicole preceded her father in death) and one very special son, Phillip "Chris" Griffith that was adopted into the family 25 years ago.
